

Steps for Submission of a Paper to the XXXth URSI General Assembly and Scientific Symposium (GASS)

1. Create your manuscript. Please carefully read and follow the [Instructions for Authors](#). *In addition*, create a plain-text-only abstract of 100 words or less. This abstract is independent from the abstract for the paper: it will appear in the *Book of Abstracts* handed out at the GASS to aid attendees in deciding which papers to attend.

2. Proofread and check the layout of your manuscript (it is highly recommended that you do this BEFORE going to IEEE PDF eXpress).

3. Create an IEEE PDF eXpress account at the [IEEE PDF eXpress Login Page](#). Please use the Conference ID: **URSIGASSx**

4a. Use the IEEE PDF eXpress Web site to generate an IEEE Xplore-compatible PDF. The above PDF eXpress site contains instructions, resources, helpful hints, and access to technical support.

OR

4b. If created a PDF from your manuscript yourself (it is *strongly* recommended that instead you use PDF eXpress), upload the PDF to PDF eXpress for checking.

5. Once you have a PDF that PDF eXpress has indicated is compliant, check the PDF (particularly, equations, figures, and tables) to be sure that you have what was intended.

6. Log into your GASS account at <http://www.papers-gass2011.ursi.org> (you probably are already logged into it if you are reading this; if you do not have an account, click on Register to create one). Submit the final IEEE Xplore-compliant PDF to the GASS Web site by clicking on Paper Submission in the menu at the top, and filling out the form. Enter (or “Copy and Paste”) the 100-word-or-less abstract into the text box in the form. Use the Upload button to upload the compliant PDF of your paper. Be sure to click on the IEEE Electronic Copyright button to electronically sign the IEEE Copyright Form.

7. A computer generated e-mail will be sent to the submitting author to provide feedback on a successful submission.

8. **Please note:** URSI and the IEEE reserve the right to exclude a paper from distribution after the conference (e.g., removal from the papers included in IEEE Xplore) if the paper is not presented at the conference.
