## **ITU DORMITORIES – Gumussuyu**

### **Gumussuyu Men's Residence Hall**

Total Capacity: 270 students (66 female, 204 male). The building was first put to use as an ITU residence hall in 1939, and was renovated in 1996. It has been equipped with all the modern conveniences for the students. Furnished rooms for 3 with a view of the Bosphorus, each of them with a bathroom and a toilet, Internet connection and telephones, study halls for common use, laundry service, ironing room, breakfast, lunch and dinner (if paid for), 24 hour hot water. This residence hall is operated by the ITU Development Foundation.

### **Gumussuyu Women's Residence Hall**

Total Capacity: 58 students. Furnished rooms for 2, 3 or 4. Study hall, computer room, lounge, laundry and ironing room, 24 hour hot water. This residence hall is operated by the ITU Development Foundation.

### **Transportation from Taksim Square To The Dormitories**

Arrive in Taksim Square by bus/metro. Then, walk down the hill starting from Atatürk Culture Center "Atatürk Kültür Merkezi (AKM)" passing the Military Hospital toward the Faculty building. If one takes a bus to Taksim Square via Gümüşsuyu hill, there is a bus stop in front of the Faculty building.

### **Transportation from Atatürk Airport To The Dormitories**

Take an express bus (HAVAŞ) for Taksim Square. After getting off the bus, walk towards the Ataturk Cultural Center (AKM) and go down the hill along the Inonu Street towards the Gumussuyu Military Hospital on the right of the street. ITU Mechanical Engineering Department is right next to Gumussuyu Military Hospital .

### **Transportation from Sabiha Gökçen Airport To The Dormitories**

Take an express bus (HAVAŞ) for Levent. After getting off the bus, take the subway to get to Taksim Square. Walk towards the Ataturk Cultural Center (AKM) and go down the hill along the Inonu Street towards the Gumussuyu Military Hospital on the right of the street. ITU Mechanical Engineering Department is right next to Gumussuyu Military Hospital.

### **Transportation from Kabataş To The Dormitories**

If you like to walk, just take the steps to go up the hill after crossing the high street. It is a 10-minute trip by foot. Otherwise, you can get on the Funiculer or use the bus 70KE whose taxiway passes through Gumussuyu to arrive the final destination Taksim Square.

### **Transportation from Beşiktaş To The Dormitories**

Take a public bus for Taksim Square and get off at Gumussuyu Bus Station.

## ISTANBUL TRANSPORTATION

Istanbul is served by two international airports. The older and larger Atatürk International Airport on the European side and the newer and smaller Sabiha Gökçen International Airport on the Asian side. There are many flights to Istanbul from almost all major airports in the world. At the airport, we recommend that you obtain enough local currency (Turkish lira) to cover your initial transfer. Better exchange rates are available at numerous downtown currency exchange offices.

### **Atatürk Airport:**

Atatürk International Airport is the major international airport in Istanbul. Located in Yeşilköy, on the European side of the city, it is 24 km west of the city centre/Taksim. You can travel between Istanbul's Atatürk Airport and the city center by shuttle buses (Havaş), Metro and tram, express city bus (IETT), taxicab or private transfer.

**Shuttle Bus (Havaş)** → Havaş airport shuttles depart from both the International and Domestic terminals at Atatürk Airport. The trip to Taksim takes between 45 to 60 minutes, depending upon traffic, and the fare is 10 TL per person (approx. 7 USD/5 EUR).

**Metro & Tram** → You can take the metro from the airport to Zeytinburnu, where you can transfer to the Kabatas tram. The tram travels through Sultanahmet Square, Sirkeci Station, the Eminönü ferry, Galata Bridge, Karaköy, and the last stop is Kabataş. At Kabataş you can transfer to the funicular (Füniküler) to Taksim Square.

**Bus** → IETT express city bus 96T, departs from Atatürk Airport and travels along the shore, stopping at the Yenikapi Ferry Terminal, Aksaray Square and Taksim Square. You can pay the cost of 2,60.-TL (approx. 1,30.-EUR) to the driver in cash.

**Taxi** → A taxicab from the airport costs about 35 TL to Sultanahmet and about 45 TL to Taksim Square. The trip takes between 35 and 75 minutes, depending on traffic.

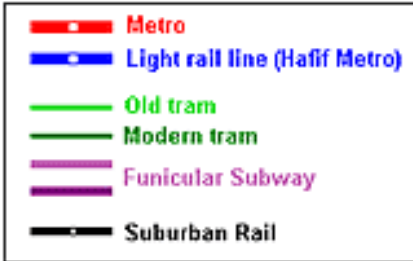
### **Sabiha Gökçen Airport:**

Sabiha Gökçen Airport (SAW) is located on the Anatolian side of Istanbul at Kurtkoy, at a distance of 50 km to the city center/Taksim. You can travel between Sabiha Gökçen Airport and the city center by shuttle buses (Havaş), taxicab or private transfer.

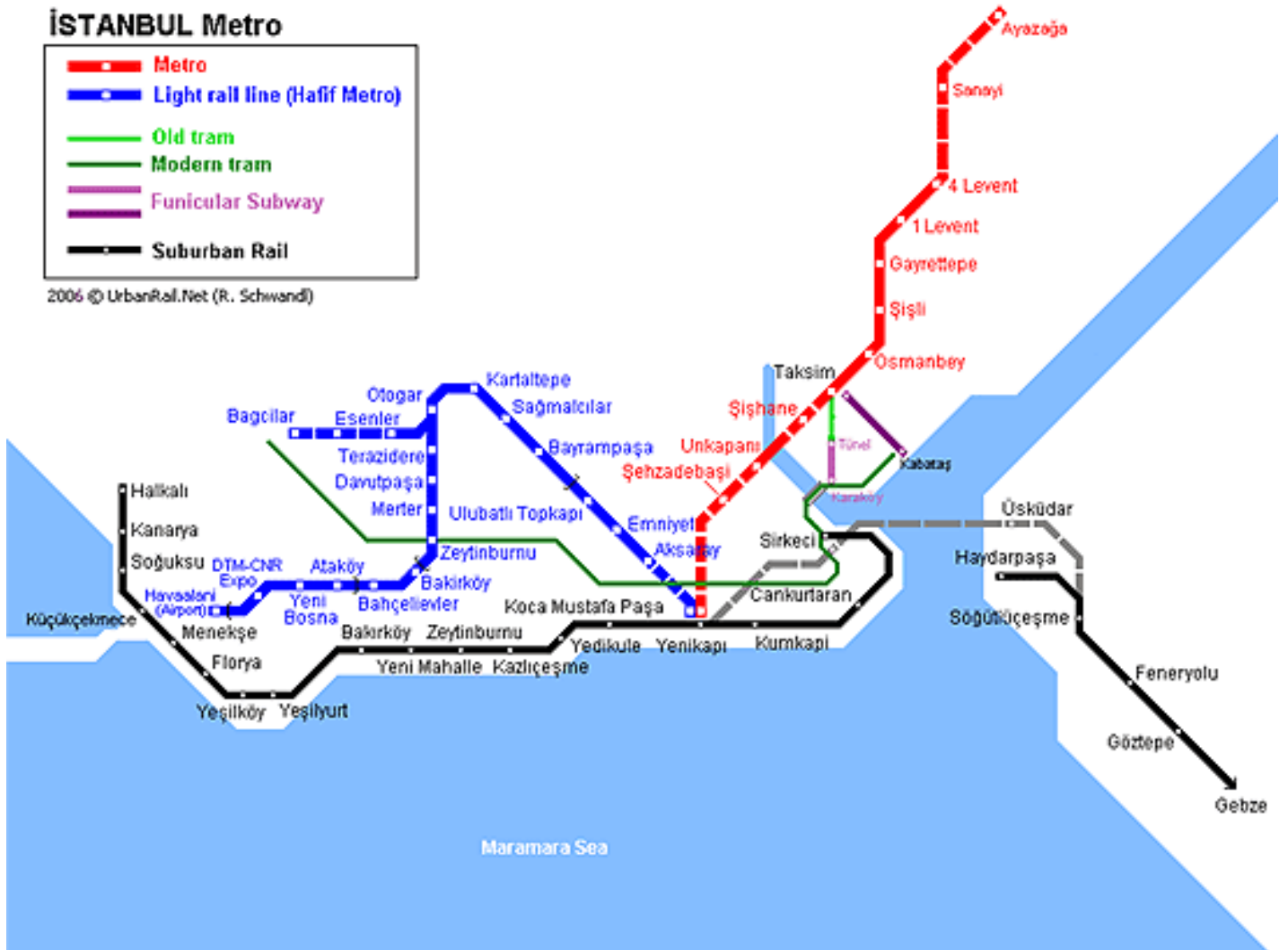
**Shuttle Bus (Havaş)** → Havaş airport shuttles are available for every aircraft landing at the airport, offering a trip to Taksim that lasts approximately 1 hour, at a cost of 13 TL. (approx. 9 USD, 6.50 EUR)

**Taxi** → There are also taxicabs available outside the terminal. Yet, it can be quite expensive if you intend to travel all the way to the city center/Taksim. The trip costs approximately 90 TL. (approx. 60 USD/45 EUR)
